Re: Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016
Prohibition of Cultivation Facilities in Little Flock

Dear Buddy:

At last evening's City Council meeting, the Planning Commission asked if the City could prohibit Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facilities in Little Flock. I have researched that question.

Section 14 of the Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 reads as follows:

Sec. 14. Local regulation

- (a) This amendment does not prohibit a city, incorporated town, or county of this state from enacting reasonable zoning regulations applicable to dispensaries or cultivation facilities, provided that those zoning regulations are the same as those for a licensed retail pharmacy.
- (b) This section does not allow a city, incorporated town, or county to prohibit the operation of any dispensaries or cultivation facilities in the city, incorporated town, or county unless such a prohibition is approved at an election under Article 5, Sec. 1, of this constitution.

Therefore, the only way to prohibit cultivation facilities in Little Flock is to have an Article 5, Sec. 1 election. Article 5, Sec. 1 deals with Initiative and Referendum.

Under Initiative, the citizens of Little Flock could present a petition signed by a number equal to at least 15% of the persons who voted in the last Mayor election. The Initiative Petition would propose an Ordinance that prohibits cultivation facilities in Little Flock. The Initiative Petition would call an election between 60 and 90 days after the Petition is presented.

Under Referendum, the Council would pass an Ordinance and delay its effective date until the citizens voted on whether to approve the Ordinance. The Ordinance would call an election.
